Welfare Benefits for Elderly Foreign Citizens without Pension

Content:

Benefits are provided for elderly foreign citizens who do not meet the residency requirements for eligibility due to nationality requirements or because of having lived abroad and are ineligible for public pension.

Monthly Allowance: 33,275 yen

Eligibility:

A resident of Ashiya City who was born on or before April 1, 1926 and who meets any of the following requirements:

- (1) One who registered his/her place of residence within Japan as of January 1, 1982 under the Alien Registration Law.
- (2) One who registered his/her place of residence on or before January 1, 1982 under the Alien Registration Law, and obtained Japanese nationality on or after April 1, 1961, and cannot fulfill the residency requirement for institutional eligibility.
- (3) A Japanese national who lived abroad for a long time, and returned on or after April 1, 1961, but cannot fulfill the residency requirement for institutional eligibility.

N.B. The following persons are not eligible:

- *. Recipients of public pension (712,000 yen or more per year)
- Recipients of Ashiya City special benefits for the handicapped with a high degree of disability
- *. Recipients of Livelihood Protection Subsidy
- . When the total income of one person, and his/her spouse, and any dependents exceeds the limitation amounts.

Report from the Kumamoto Earthquake Stricken Area

From October 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017, I was transferred temporarily to Mashiki-machi, and was working at the Agricultural and Forestry Division of the Agricultural Administration Section of Mashiki-machi. Mashiki-machi suffered the most serious damages from the quake. In many areas of the town, the ground sank 1 to 1.5 meters due to fault slips, and roads, irrigation canal sand spillways were destroyed. These area cannot be cultivated. Many farming people gave up growing rice and switched to soybeans. Some have figured out that growing corns restores soil productivity. They want the area to return to its previous



state. I engaged in the assessment work to restore the devastated farmland. A year has already passed since the earthquake of April 2016, but many parts of the town are still left untouched. From now on, the work will be done intensively where there is a higher priority. In many other

stricken areas in Kumamoto, people are also making every possible efforts. What we can do

here in Ashiya, far from Kumamoto, is to be keep the people of Kumamoto in our thought, which will lead to the reconstruction.

Present Circumstances and Issues seen from the Kumamoto Earthquake

With the enforcement of Anti-Discrimination Laws in April 2016, we are required to offer reasonable attention to disabled people and persons requiring assistance.

It is necessary that the disadvantage of being disabled must not be borne solely by those people but must become the responsibility of the whole society. There are many issues on how to provide safety during emergency situations.

In the Kumamoto earthquake, a family with an autistic child had to spend many nights in a car. It took not a little time to set up places of refuge for those who have difficulties with mobility, vision, hearing and non-visible disabilities, as mentioned above, because both administrative bodies and citizens lacked understanding and failed to provide information to ensure their safety. Temporary houses were prepared. Naturally, there were slopes for wheelchairs at the entrance but rooms were not designed for persons who are wheelchair bound. It is important to discuss an individual emergency plan with supporters and administrative bodies. It is also necessary to aim for a society where the elderly, disabled persons, foreigners and women can regularly take part in the decision making process.

Foreigners next door

Recently we see more foreign tourists and residents in our neighborhoods. Today, more than 2.3 million people from abroad are living in Japan and the number of tourists is Increasing remarkably. Even if you don't have any connection or relationship with them, you are actually in daily contact with foreigners. Foreign students working at convenience stores is not uncommon. A nursing care worker who helps your family may be from a Southeast Asian country. Many foreigners work and support fishing industry and agriculture sector. We have lived together with people connected to South and North Korea and Taiwan for a long time, but now more and more foreigners from many other parts of the world are living here.

Feeling unease at differences

It seems to be a matter of course that we share common customs and manners with our neighbors. We live according to the same rules, enjoy chatting about what's in bento lunches or garbage disposal. However, when we move out to the next town,

we often get confused by the different way of disposing garbage. For foreigners, their confusion in daily life is quite natural. For example, let's think about a pupil from abroad who is enrolled in a certain school but who doesn't understand Japanese. His class teacher who was at a loss, advised the pupil's mother that the child should attend school after they learn some Japanese. Where and how long does the pupil learn Japanese before they can attend elementary school or junior high school?

In Ashiya, schools, the Board of Education and volunteers are making efforts but it is still very much a process of trial and error.

In another example, in one apartment, foreigners gathered almost every week. Neighboring Japanese families felt uneasy and thinking they were dangerous, moved out. Actually, they were Muslims and they just assembled to say prayers every Friday noon, because there were no mosques nearby. We often look warily at people with whom we have no contact at all.

Constructive Multi-cultural society

It has been said that we should build a multi-cultural society or we should support foreigners when they don't know what to do in everyday life. Coexistence does not mean that one party helps another party or that they become used to each other.

When a Tsunami warning is issued, it doesn't make sense to say "I will explain the situation, so if you understand, take refuge." It might be better for you to grab their hands forcibly and run for safety.

In the case of garbage disposal, the community does not work well without everyone following the rules. Another example: some may say to those who regard hugging customary that they should refrain from hugging in front of others because it is not very common in Japan. What do you think you would do?

Everyone has his own religion, sex, age, and physical features and customs. But as the diversity increases in society, conflicts escalate and become difficult to deal with. What should we do when we are at odds with others? How can we understand our differences and accept them?

The first step is to recognize the existence of the other party. Look at what you think to be common sense from a slightly different angle. You will find tolerance within yourself, and then you can enjoy the differences. Then you will encourage the rules to be shared and learn to accept people who are different from you.



Lumps or Swelling of Legs may be caused by Varicose Veins

Do you have trouble sleeping because your legs are swollen, tired or cramped? Varicose veins may be causing these symptoms.

If you have varicose veins, the veins running on the surface of your leg swell up unevenly, or blood vessels stand out in a net-like appearance. Basically, they will not disappear naturally. The progress of symptoms is generally slow; however, it gets worse little by little as time goes by. If it gets more severe, skin ulcers may break out, making treatment difficult in some cases.

Besides these symptoms, the outward appearance may distress you, and you may hesitate to expose your legs or to visit a hot-spring resort.

A considerable number of people develop varicose veins; it is said that about 10% of those 40 years old or up, and about 50 % of women who have been pregnant and given birth have varicose veins.

It is thought to be the main cause of varicose veins that the function of a valve inside the vein deteriorates, causing the regurgitation of blood.

First, an examination by Ultrasonic waves or MRI is necessary in order to find out which caused the swelling or lump in your leg, the vein or an artery or a blood clot?

As a treatment measure, besides surgery, there are cases where symptoms improve and progress is prevented by wearing compression stockings. Feel free to consult us.

If you are concerned, we recommend you to visit the outpatient varicose vein clinic in Ashiya Municipal Hospital.

- History of landslide Disasters in the Rokko Mountains and its Erosion Control Work-

The south slope of the Rokko Mountains is a steep slope, only 7km to the sea and the summit is 931 meters above sea level. Most of the mountains are made of granite. Granite is known as a very hard rock, but easily turns into sand once weathered by exposure to wind and rain. Those features cause landslides or a collapse of the slope with sudden torrential rain falling over a limited area.

The Rokko Erosion Control Office is building a weir, carrying out reinforcement work, and slope protection. In Ashiya, protection work is under way at Takigatani on the Ashiyagawa River. Besides, as a part of a national afforestation campaign, we support the tree-planting by citizens' organization, business groups, and elementary school children.

It is important to raise awareness and readiness among individuals, families and local communities. If the quantity of river waters seems to decrease in spite of continuous rain fall, the river water becomes muddy, or logs are flowing in it, it may be a sign of a debris flow. You can hear the mountain rumbling. Premonitory symptoms of landslides are: pebbles are clattering, or cracks appear on precipice and bluffs. If you detect these phenomenon, do not go near the river or cliffs.


